



What is a Learning Style?

A **Learning Style** is how someone processes information the best. These can be **Visual**, **Kinesthetic**, or **Auditory**. Below are eight known intelligences, or strengths.

- **Kinesthetic:** Learns by doing
- **Visual-Spatial:** Learns by seeing
- **Auditory:** Learns by hearing
- **Interpersonal:** People Smart
- **Logical-Mathematical:** Logic Smart
- **Naturalistic:** Nature Smart
- **Intrapersonal:** Self Smart
- **Musical:** Music Smart

Why is a Learning Inventory Important?

For the Children:

- Children will know how they learn best and which ways they enjoy more.
- They will learn studying habits that fits their own style.
- If they are learning with their style, they will take more out of the lesson.

For the Parents:

- Parents will feel more at ease knowing their children are learning at school.
- Parents do not have to watch their children struggle at home.
- The satisfaction on their children's success is an amazing benefit.

For the Teachers:

- Knowing each child's learning style will help the teacher educate the children the way they actually learn.
- The students will catch on to concepts easier, so
- There will be less time spent backtracking and redoing lessons.

A **Learning Inventory** is a test to determine how your child learns best. A **Multiple Intelligences** quiz determines which of the eight intelligences listed on the back your child is most similar to.

Learning Inventory: Directions

- Ask your child the questions and have him or her answer it. If your child can read and answer the questions by him or herself, let him or her fill it out.
- Circle the one that fits BEST for your child.
- When completed, count out each letter and add them to the bottom of the sheet (or on a scratch piece of paper if there is not an available printer.
- The letter with the highest number is your child's learning style. If there is a tie, your child has multiple learning styles.
